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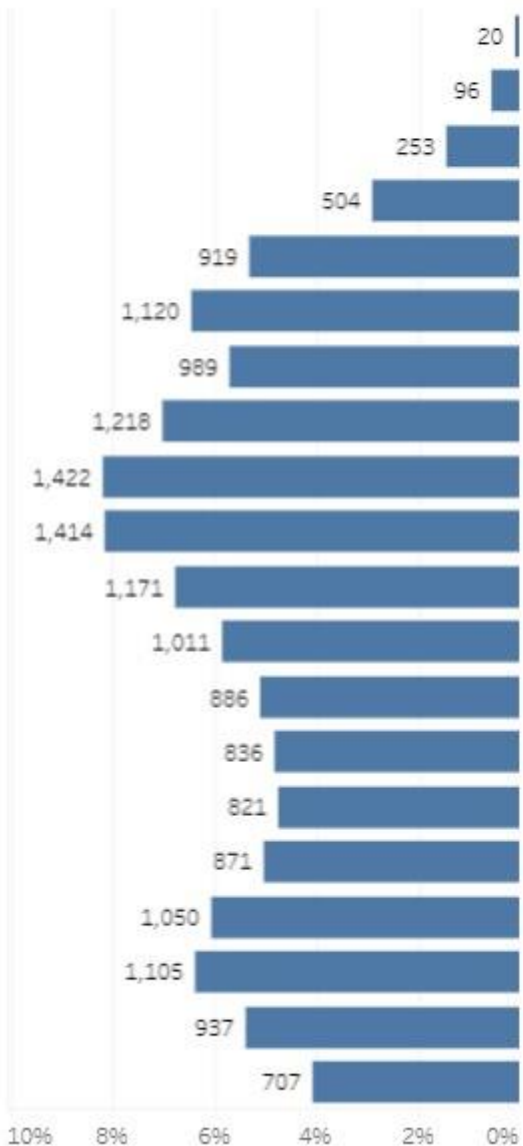
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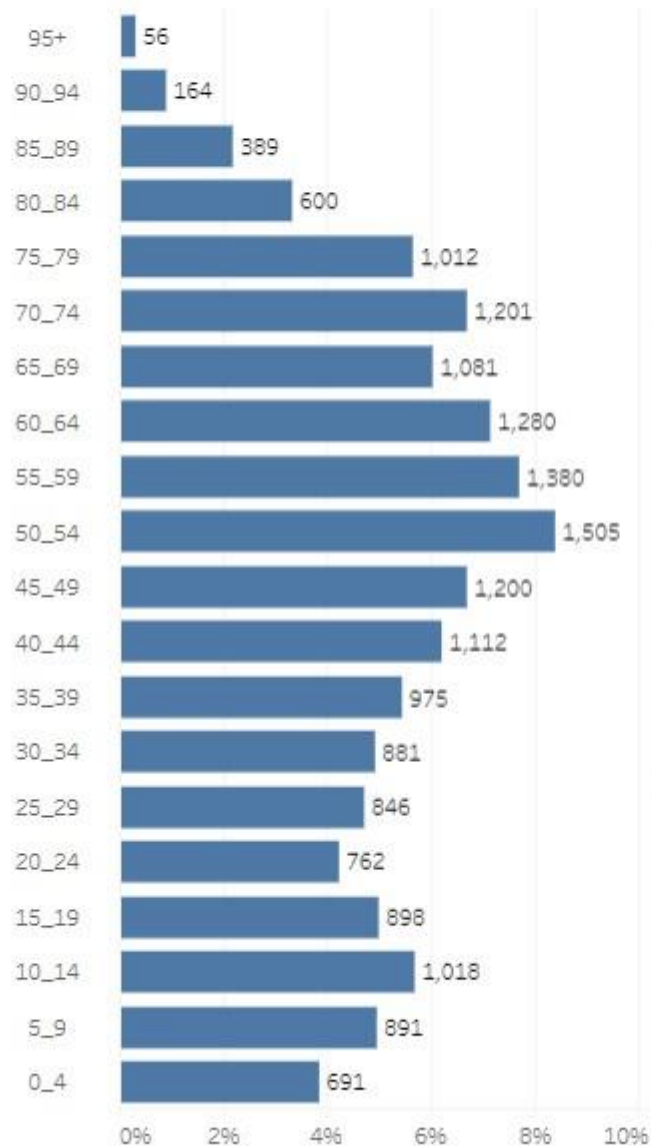
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Registered population, April 2022

Practice locations and Ward boundaries



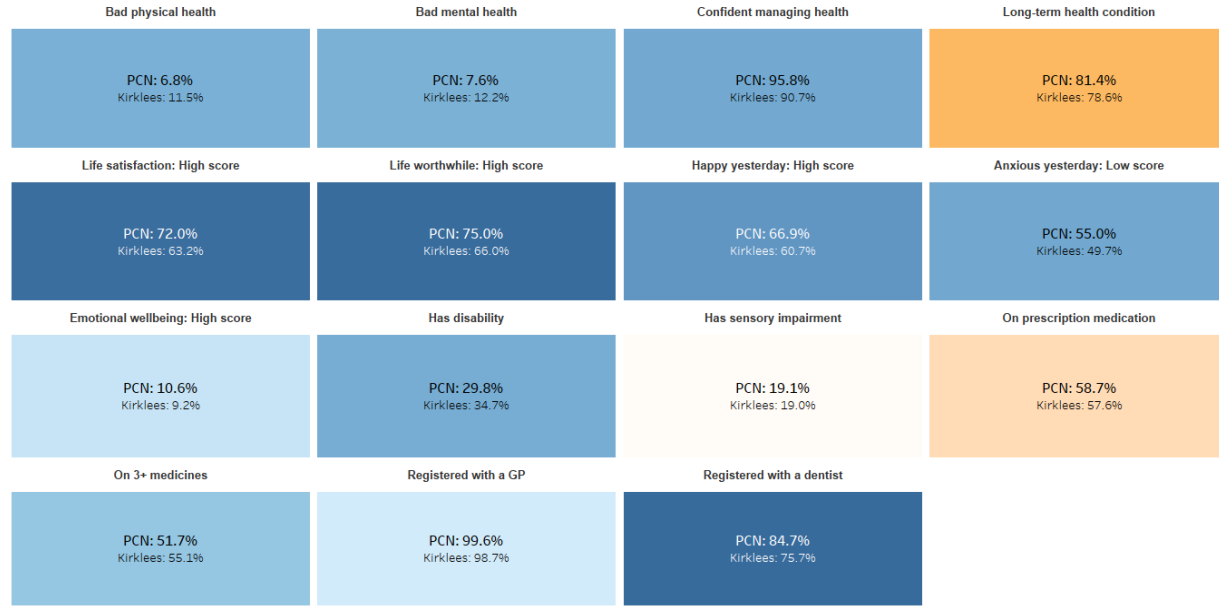

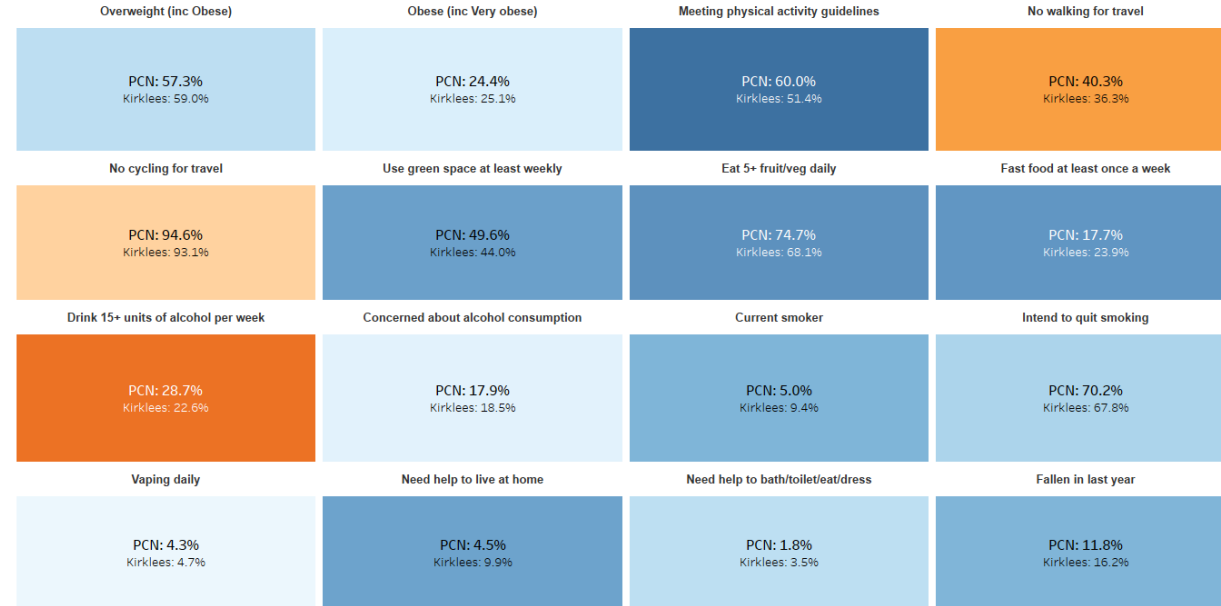

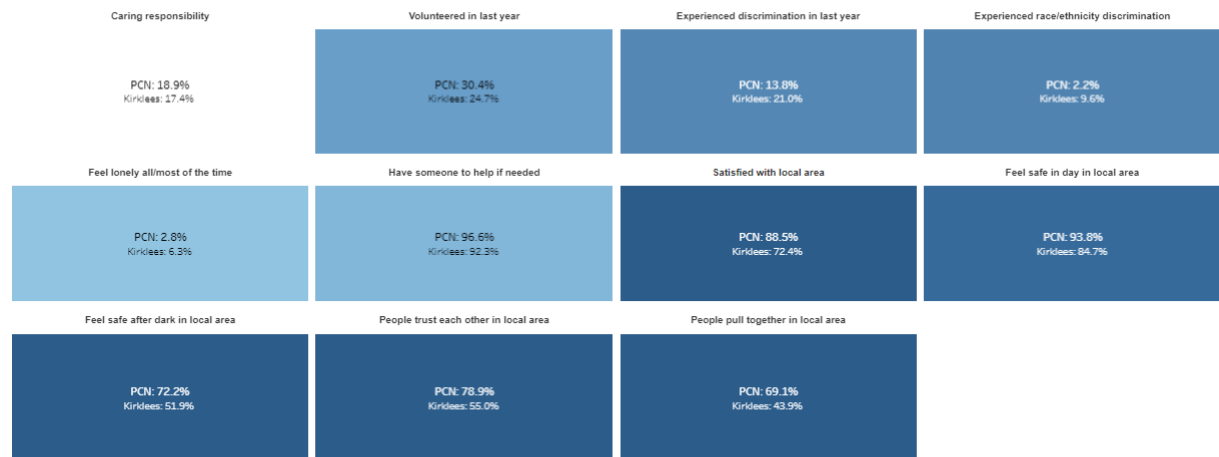

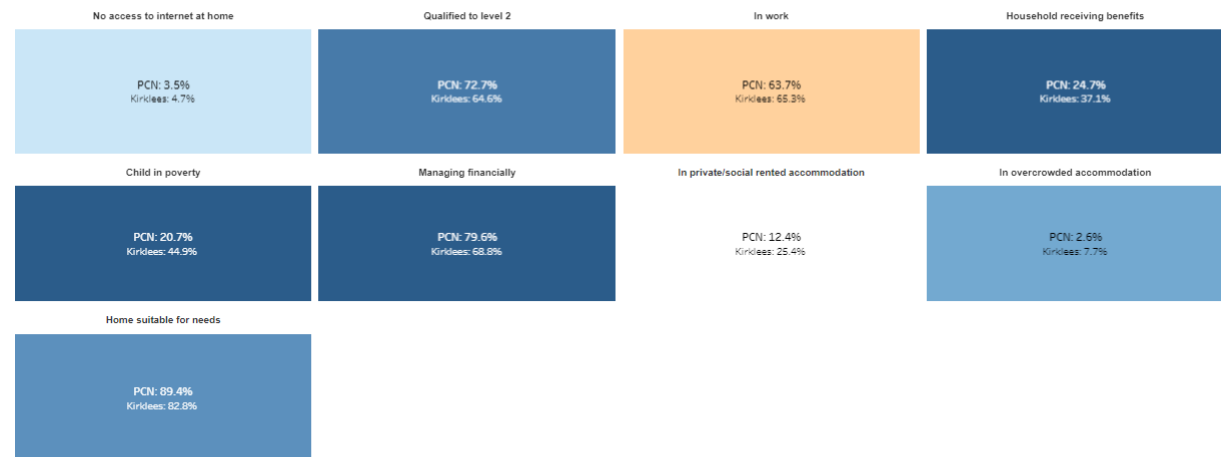

Summary of differences: The Mast PCN

CLiK summary

Across 52 indicators, The Mast PCN was one of the best three PCNs for 41 indicators and one of the worst three PCNs for 7 indicators. Across PCNs, The Mast had the highest number of CLiK indicators which were better than the Kirklees average. People were more likely to agree that people pull together in their local area. There are also higher levels of community trust and feeling safe in the local area after dark. Across PCNs, household income is highest for residents in The Mast PCN, and people were more likely to be satisfied with their local area compared to Kirklees overall.

Only a few indicators were worse than the Kirklees average for this PCN. People in this area were less likely to walk for travel and more likely to drink alcohol in excess (i.e., 15 or more units per week) compared to Kirklees overall.

CLiK: Long-term health conditions

Anxiety was the most reported long-term health condition for residents in The Mast PCN, although rates were lowest in this PCN compared to all other PCNs. Musculoskeletal/rheumatological conditions were the second most reported in this locality, followed by depression. There were higher rates of menopause related conditions in The Mast compared to Kirklees overall.

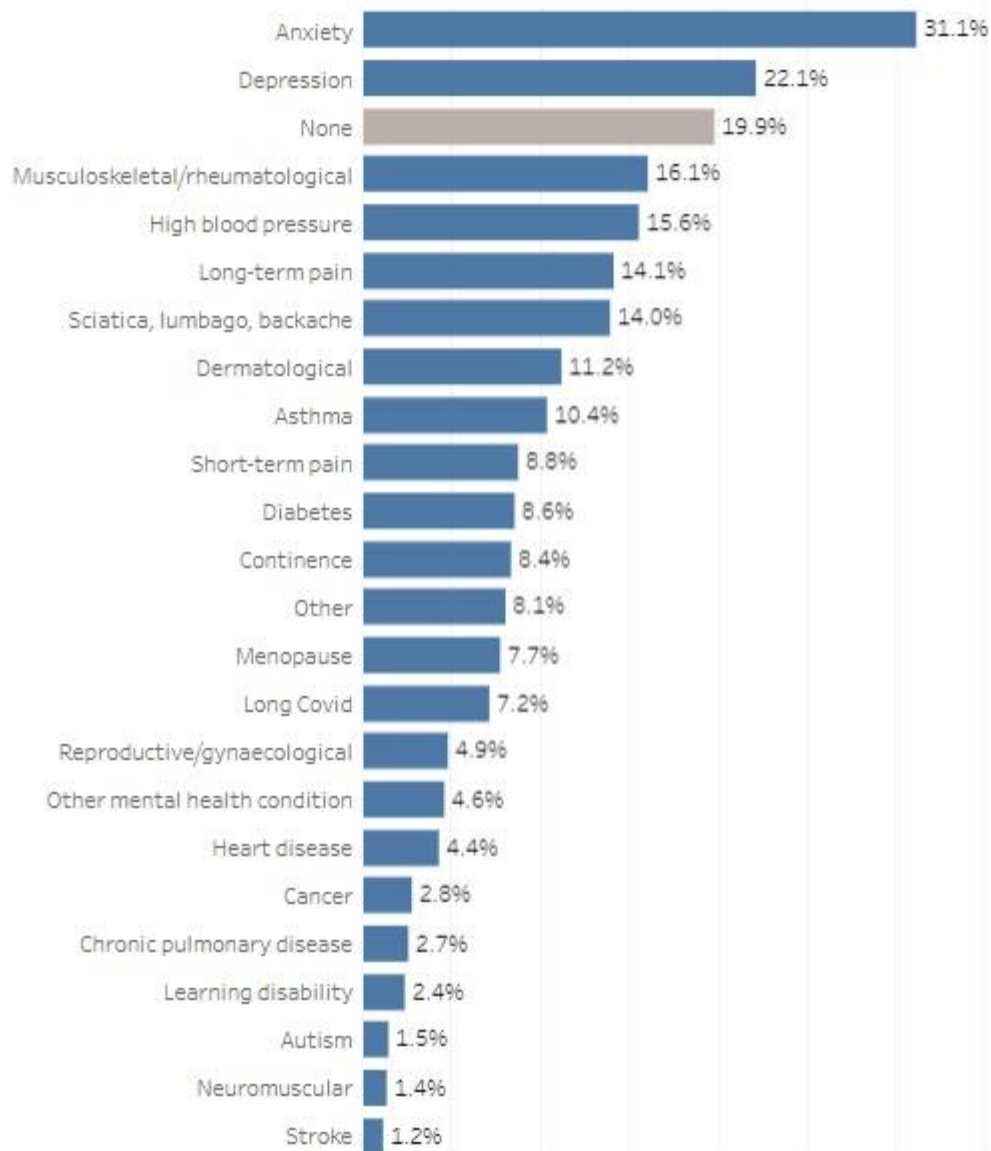
