
# Mental Health Intelligence Summary: Dewsbury


# Introduction

- These packs were compiled by the Public Health Intelligence team at Kirklees Council to give an
  overview of population indicators related to mental health. Additional information around
  diagnosed mental health conditions is available at GP practice level if required, although it should
  be noted that many people with mental health issues may not have a formal diagnosis.
- Most of the adult indicators are taken from the 2016 CLiK survey (sample size: 8,500 people) this data has been aggregated to place level, but could be split by ward. Due to the sample size, data cannot be meaningfully presented at a smaller geographical level than ward.
- Most of the child indicators are taken from the 2018 Kirklees Young People's Survey of Year 9 pupils (sample size: 2,000, representing around 40% of all Year 9 pupils) – this data has been aggregated to place level. Due to the lower sample size, data cannot be meaningfully presented at a smaller geographical level than place.


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

## Dewsbury Summary

## Strengths (indicators significantly better than Kirklees average):

- Low proportion of adults exceeding recommended drinking levels
- Low proportion of young people worrying most days
- High proportion of young people say they talk to someone if they have a problem
- Low levels of young people drinking alcohol monthly
- Low proportion of young people who have been recently bullied

#### **Challenges** (indicators significantly worse than Kirklees average):

- High levels of adults reporting low life satisfaction, low happiness and feelings of anxiety, depression and loneliness
- Lower proportion of adults who are resilient
- Even proportion of adults who are socially connected, and this trend has been worsening
- Example 2 Lower levels of adults who are satisfied with and feel safe in their local area
- Example 2 Lower levels of adults using green spaces
- Example 2 Lower than average household incomes and high numbers of people worrying about money
- Above average levels of smoking, although this trend is significantly improving
- multiple High levels of obesity

- Wery low levels of young people using active travel (walking or cycling) to get to school



- Words in Mind bi-monthly at Dewsbury library
- Bramwell Sports workshops for young people with mental health or emotional issues
