



Practice locations and Ward boundaries Denholme Bradford Pudsey





Summary of differences: The Valleys PCN

CLiK summary

Across 52 indicators, The Valleys PCN was one of the best three PCNs for 33 indicators and one of the worst three PCNs for 4 indicators. Across PCNs, The Valleys had the second highest number of CLiK indicators which were better than the Kirklees average. People in this locality were the most likely to say that people pull together in their local area, and were the most likely to say their area is a place where people trust each other. People were also much more likely to meet the weekly recommended amount of physical activity per week and use green spaces more frequently compared to Kirklees overall. People in The Valleys PCN reported higher household income and were more likely to be qualified to level 2 compared to Kirklees overall.

Across PCNs, the highest proportion of residents who drink alcohol in excess (i.e., 15 or more units a week) live in this PCN.

CLiK: Long-term health conditions

Sciatica/lumbago/backache was the third most reported LTC where more residents reported this condition compared to the Kirklees average. There were also higher rates of asthma, menopause and long-term pain in The Valleys PCN compared to Kirklees overall. Residents in this locality were less likely to report having diabetes and/or high blood pressure compared to Kirklees overall.


